In a recent document, the BACP (2015) defined school based counselling as, "a professional activity, delivered by qualified practitioners in schools. Counsellors offer troubled and/or distressed children and young people an opportunity to explore and understand their difficulties within a relationship of agreed confidentiality".

In this workshop, we will explore the impact of a school/education setting on the counselling process.

Some of the issues that we will explore:

- Models of delivering school based counselling
- Working in partnership with the school staff and policies
- Monitoring and evaluating school based counselling
- Access to counselling and the referral process
- Scheduling appointments and the school timetable
- Managing confidentiality
- Support and supervision
